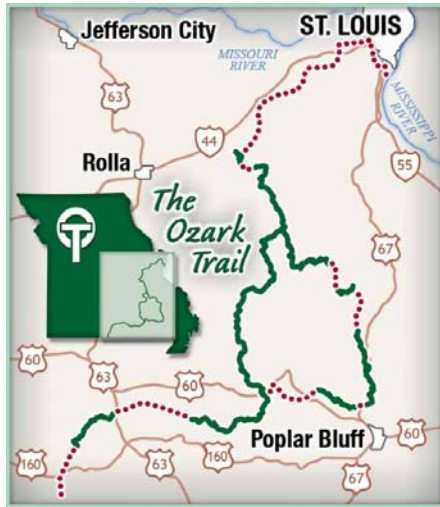


Join in the Mission

The Mission

The Ozark Trail is part of a vision, conceived in 1977, to build a scenic and varied route through the Ozark wilderness, stretching from the St. Louis metropolitan area southwestward to the Arkansas border, eventually connecting to the Ozark Highlands Trail - creating a 700-mile through-trail. About 550 miles of trail have been completed, with 350 miles in Missouri.

The Ozark Trail Association is a non-profit organization dedicated to finishing that vision.

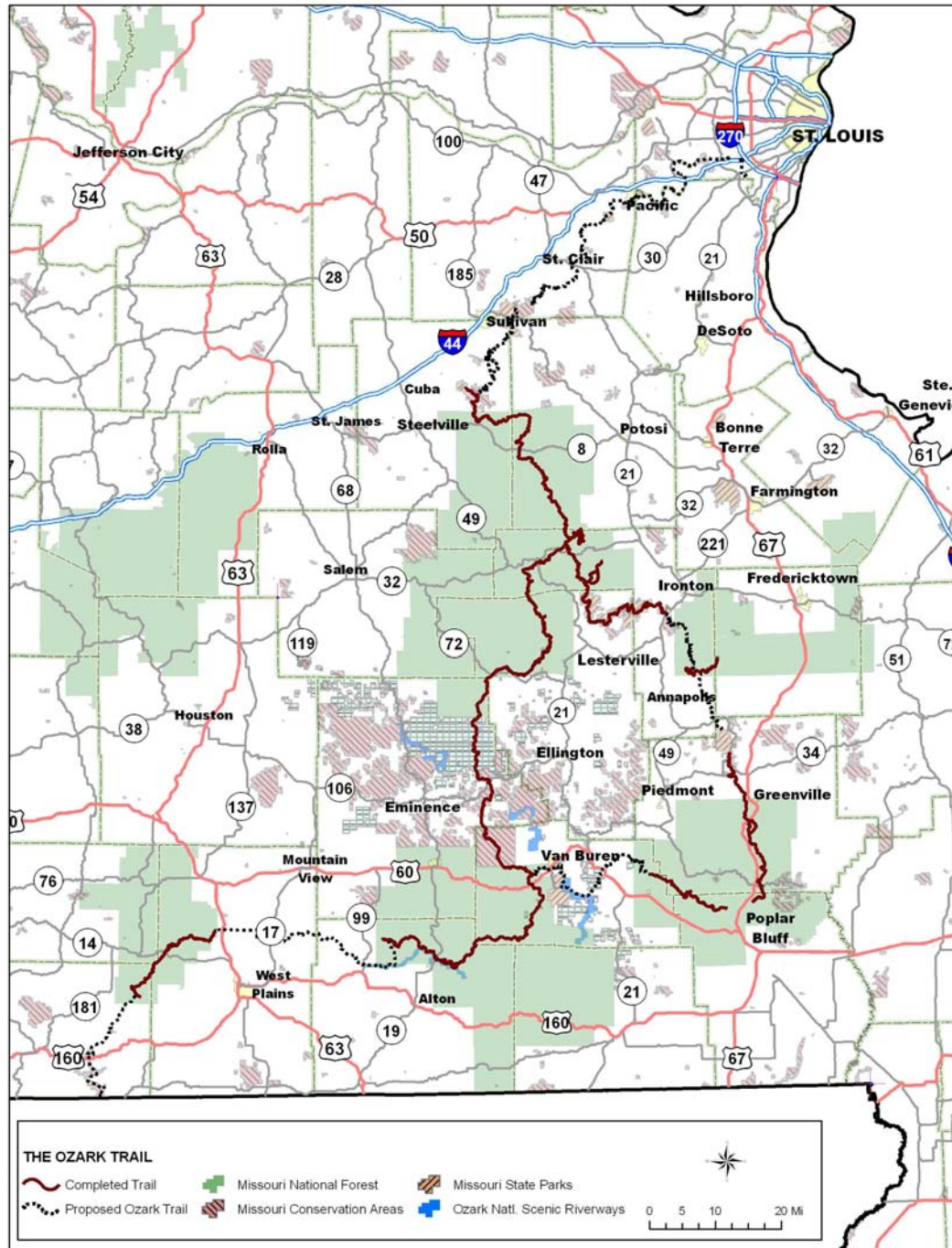

Ozark Trail - At a glance



Courtois (40 Miles)

Includes Huzzah Conservation Area, west half of Berryman Trail and about 3 miles of gravel road through Bass' Resort.

Trace Creek (24 Miles)

Runs from Hazel Creek Camp to Highway A at Bell Mountain; connects with Middle Fork section near Council Bluff Lake.

Taum Sauk (33 Miles)

One of the best trails in the state. Can be divided into 15, 12 and 6-mile subsections. Goes through Johnson's Shut-Ins and Taum Sauk Mountain State Parks.

Middle Fork (25 Miles)

The newest Ozark Trail section. Runs from the Trace Creek section near Council Bluff Lake to Highway J at Oates.

Karkaghne (28 Miles)

Extends from Highway J at Oates to Highway 72 near Reynolds. Goes through Sutton Bluff Recreation Area.

Blair Creek (26 Miles)

Starts at Reynolds, runs through the Roger Pryor Backcountry for 10 miles and ends at Powder Mill Recreation Area at Highway 106.

Current River (30 Miles)

Runs from Powder Mill Recreation Area at Highway 106 on the Current River, up Stegall Mountain, close to Rocky Falls, through Peck Ranch to Highway 60 near Van Buren. A fabulous section!

Between the Rivers (30 Miles)

From Highway 60 near Van Buren, the section bridges the gap between the Current River and the Eleven Point. Skirts the Irish Wilderness.

Eleven Point (30 Miles)

Starts in the middle of nowhere, ends in the middle of nowhere; but in between has fantastic views of the Eleven Point River. Side trail to McCormack Lake.

North Fork (25 Miles)

The eastern 11 miles of this section was recently refurbished. Begins just west of Pomona and runs to Devil's Backbone Wilderness. Incorporates the Ridge Runner Trail.

Marble Creek (8 Miles)

Runs from Marble Creek campground to Crane Lake. Does not connect to any other section.

Wappapello (35 Miles)

Starts at Sam A. Baker State Park and runs through Wappapello Lake property to Highway 172.

Victory (18 Miles)

An old horse trail system, some of which now is officially a part of the Ozark Trail. Runs from Highway 172 to Highway V north of Ellsinore.
